THEME(S) – THE B.C. SUMMER GAMES WILL BE HOSTED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS THE WEEK BEFORE COUNTRY FEST AND MAPLE RIDGE IS CELEBRATING ITS 150TH YEAR. IN LINE WITH THESE EVENTS, WE HAVE 2 THEMES – ‘FUN AND GAMES’ AND ‘MAPLE RIDGE 150’

Goals and Objectives of the Maple Ridge Pitt Meadows Agricultural Association

1. To stage an annual fair which will be a showcase for quality livestock, produce of the soil, home crafts, youth work, and community life in general.
2. To support and encourage the 4-H program in its aims of developing personal skills, a sense of community, and good citizenship in our youth.
3. To demonstrate the value of agriculture to our economy through demonstrations and displays.
4. To bring together rural and urban peoples in an atmosphere of wholesome entertainment and good sportsmanship – promoting understanding and co-operation for the benefit of all.

General Rules and Regulations

These rules and regulations apply to **ALL** exhibitors, employees, tradesmen, concession personnel and/or any persons connected with Maple Ridge Pitt Meadows Country Fest with no exceptions, unless noted and approved by the executive committee. Such decisions are final.

- 1) Any exhibitor who violates any of the general rules or any of the rules printed in the prize list, shall, upon the decision of the executive committee, be liable to forfeiture of any prize monies or awards, and may be barred from further competition for a period of time to be decided by the executive committee.
- 2) Management reserves the right to decide any issues not covered by the rules and to correct any error or make any necessary alterations in the prize list or catalogue.

- 3) Without prejudices, Maple Ridge Pitt Meadows Agricultural Association reserves the right to reject any entry, display, or concession and reserves the right to refuse any entry and return any entry fee without being liable for compensation.
- 4) All livestock, equipment, and other exhibits must remain in display areas until 4pm for B.C. Interior and Vancouver Island clubs B.C., 5pm for Fraser Valley Clubs and 6pm for North Fraser 4H District clubs on SUNDAY, the closing date and time of Country Fest. Any exhibitor who fails to abide by this rule automatically forfeits all prize money.
- 5) Exhibitors' animals, machinery in motion, and exhibits liable to cause accidents, injury or damage to property, or persons coming in contact with them, shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact therewith. Any such exhibitor shall indemnify the association for all claims and demands, costs, charges and expenses it may incur, suffer, or be put to, by reason of any accident, or if any person be injured or suffer damage through or by reason of any such exhibit, performance, or concession not being properly guarded or the public not being properly protected there from.
- 6) The association shall not be liable for any loss to any exhibitor, caused by fire, accident, condition of structure or the negligence, howsoever of any exhibitors, officials or other personnel. NO CLAIM for injury to any person or property shall ever be suited or asserted, instituted or maintained, against the association, its officers or agents, by or on behalf of any visitor, exhibitor or any person, firm or corporation or their agents' representatives, servants or employees, having license and privilege to visit or exhibit on the grounds of the exhibition or occupying space thereon.
- 7) All exhibits shall be under the control and direction of the officials concerned, but SOLELY at the risk of the exhibitor. All stands and exhibits must be removed by the time specified or they become the property of the association for disposal. The buildings will be open the morning following the fair on request. Arrange with the office personnel.
- 8) While the association will take every precaution to ensure the safety of articles and stock on exhibition, let it be distinctly understood that the owners are required to assume all risks and should any article or animal be accidentally injured, lost or stolen, the association will render all assistance in its power to bring about recovery of same, but will not be held responsible for such loss and will not recognize any claim for payment of the value or portion thereof.
- 9) Exhibits not accompanied by their owners or agents must be considered entirely at owner's risk and may be shipped to Maple Ridge Pitt Meadows Country Fest, care of the association, that will receive them at the fairgrounds if all cartage and other charges have been prepaid. Return charges should also be included.
- 10) Any person may become a member of the association by registering at anytime.

Judges

- 1) A judge's decision, representing his/her personal preference, is not protectible unless alleged to be in violation of the rules.
- 2) The judges will be appointed by the fair committee before the fair and will receive letters of information (re: their respective duties and when and where to report upon arrival at the fairgrounds). Judging will commence as close as possible to times stated in the prize list - see division headings. No person will be allowed to act as judge who is in any way connected with

the exhibits to be judged. Judges are requested to become familiar with the rules and regulations of this fair.

- 3) Any person who shall attempt to interfere with the judge or influence the judge while in discharge of his/her duties, or who at any time on the exhibition grounds, shall use contemptuous or abusive language to any judge or fair official, shall forfeit his/her right to any or all prize money which he/she may have been awarded, and may be excluded from exhibition for one year thereafter. Judges and officials are especially requested to report any breach of this regulation to the office manager immediately.
- 4) No person other than attendants holding animals being exhibited, judges and ring clerks shall be permitted in the ring or pens at time of judging.
- 5) The decision of the judges is final in all cases except where fraud judging is proven. In such cases, a referee may be appointed to make the final decision, even if such a circumstance is discovered after judging is complete.
- 6) Each convener of a division is charged with caring for and handing in to the **OFFICE MANAGER** the judging sheets for each division, with the awards duly noted and properly entered. **EACH SHEET** shall bear the signature of the judge and any comments he/she may make. When respectfully requested to do so, judges may give reasons for their decisions.

Protests

- 1) Any exhibitor who wishes to enter a protest must do so in writing before the close of the fair. The protest must be accompanied by \$25 in cash or certified cheque, which will be refunded if the protest is upheld. If the protest is not substantiated, the money is forfeited and shall be added to the exhibition funds.

Prize Money

- 1) Prize money will be mailed **before August 31st, 2024**. Exhibitors who do not receive their prize awards within a reasonable time after October 31st, please notify the association, Maple Ridge Pitt Meadows Agricultural Association, Box 403, Maple Ridge, B.C. V2X 8K9. No prize money cheque will be reissued after December 31st, 2024. The association will not be responsible for prize awards and trophies offered by individuals, clubs, companies, or for the payment of special premiums offered on behalf of anyone except the association itself.
- 2) All prize cheques should be cashed promptly upon receipt. **ALL CHEQUES WILL BE CONSIDERED A DONATION TO THE ASSOCIATION IF NOT CASHED BY DECEMBER 31ST, 2024.**
- 3) No accounts payable will be considered unless accompanied by an exhibition association purchase order properly authorized by the office manager or designated fair official.
- 4) No prize awards other than those won at this fair may be displayed. Any violation of this rule will result in forfeiture of any or all prize monies.

LIVESTOCK

- 1) All feed and bedding for livestock and feed containers will have to be provided by the exhibitors, except for initial bedding.
- 2) Livestock committees reserve the right to order the removal of any exhibit that in their opinion shows evidence of contagious disease.
- 3) All livestock must be stalled within its category.

Parking & Security

- 1) No person under the age of 14 will be permitted to remain on the grounds after 10p.m. unless under the supervision of parents or other responsible adults. No one under the age of 14 will be permitted to stay in the barns to attend animals between 10p.m. and 6a.m. without the supervision of a responsible adult. Exhibitors are asked to make prior arrangements for the care of their livestock during the night, if such attention is required. (Night closing is 10p.m. to 6a.m.)
- 2) Safety Patrol personnel will enforce curfew rules in all buildings. Barns, 10pm to 6am, other buildings 10pm to 10am.
- 3) **NO PARKING ON GROUNDS** without permission. All vehicles required on the grounds must be parked in designated areas and will be supplied with a parking permit that must be displayed. Vehicles not displaying a permit will be towed. All costs and responsibilities will be borne by the owner of the offending vehicle.
- 4) Vehicles that are the responsibility of the Maple Ridge Pitt Meadows Agricultural Association are not to be used by exhibitors.
- 5) **Alcohol must NOT** be consumed in barns, fairgrounds/ parking areas or in the presence of a 4-H member.

4H Divisions

Entry Deadline: 4-H entries must be submitted by Tuesday July 2nd, 2024

Prize Money: 1st - \$4; 2nd - \$3; 3rd - \$2

Rules:

1. Classes shall be open to 4H clubs and members properly enrolled in British Columbia, on an invitational basis as space permits.
2. Grounds admission – FREE!!
3. All 4H clubs must have their animals on the grounds before 10 p.m. Friday, July 26th or before 9am on Saturday, July 27th (**Beef must be in place by 5:00 pm Friday**). Release time on Sunday July 28th is 4pm for Vancouver Island, Northern B.C. and B.C. Interior clubs, 5pm for Fraser Valley clubs and 6pm for North Fraser 4H District clubs.
4. **NO PARKING ON THE GROUNDS WITHOUT A PERMIT. Camping/parking area to be determined and map will be sent to leaders prior to fair.**
5. Judging will be on the Danish System for showmanship, livestock placing classes, and the home arts placing classes.
6. Ages of 4-H members for competition purposes are ages as of December 31st, 2023.
7. All general rules and regulations governing Maple Ridge Pitt Meadows Country Fest applies to ALL exhibitors, as well as specific 4H rules.
8. Members must exhibit their own project animals.
9. All 4H rules and regulations apply to the Country Fest 4-H competitions.
10. Any clipping or grooming of a 4H animal at Country Fest must be done by the 4-H member (19 years and under). Other 4H club members may provide assistance if necessary. Clipping and

grooming must not be done by an adult or leader or that animal will be disqualified from competition.

11. Any 4H member consuming or under the influence of alcohol/drugs or exhibiting in improper fashion will be barred from competition and may forfeit any prize money that has been awarded.
12. No 4H members may sleep in the barns.

Leased Animals: No leased or partnership market animals are permitted. Any market animal registered for the show must be solely owned by the 4H Exhibitor and proof of ownership may be required.

Homegrown Class: Projects (steer, heifer, cow) must have been bred, born and raised on the BC property where you keep your animals (you might lease property for your animals but live elsewhere). The animal is to be owned by the member or the member's family unit. (Family unit to include parents or legal guardian, 4-H member's siblings, or grandparents)

The member is to select and raise a quality feeder animal or heifer to be a maximum of 12 months of age on achievement day (born in the calendar year). The member will learn basic feeding, husbandry, showmanship, grooming and judging, and will gain an appreciation of basic animal welfare, while raising and handling a young beef animal. The calf is raised for show only (i.e. not eligible for market) and the member will exhibit their project on achievement day. The calf from a Unit 2 project may also be used as the calf portion of Unit 5 or 6.

Note: A member may lease or purchase a calf from a fellow member registered in Unit 5 or 6, but it is the responsibility of the Unit 2 member to feed, train, groom, and exhibit the calf independently for purposes of achievement.

4H Rabbit

The proper pen designed for a rabbit should be made of an inedible material such as metal and have a double wire partition. The double wire partition prevents the rabbits from biting and clawing one another, etc. For this reason, poultry cages should not be used to house the rabbits because they have a single wire partition, which offers little protection. There are three types of pens designed for different size animals according to weight. For animals that weigh a maximum of 2.72 kg. (6 lbs.) a small pen 38 cm x 41 cm x 38 cm (15 in. x 16 in. x 15 in.) is used. For animals with a medium weight of between 2.72 kg. and 5.44 kg. (6lbs. - 12lbs.) a pen size of 53 cm x 58 cm (21 in. x 23 in.) is recommended. For larger animals weighing over 5.44 km. (12 lbs.) a pen of 76 cm x 69 cm (30 in. x 27 in.) is recommended.
